

**SECOND AMENDMENT TO NRP FUNDING AGREEMENT NO. 43476
BETWEEN
CITY OF MINNEAPOLIS
AND
EAST PHILLIPS IMPROVEMENT COALITION**

(East Phillips Neighborhood: Youth Programming Partnership Initiatives)

THIS AMENDMENT, entered into this 2nd day of Jan, 2019, by and between the **City of Minneapolis** (herein called the "City") and the **East Phillips Improvement Coalition**, a Minnesota nonprofit corporation (the "Contractor").

WHEREAS, the City and the Contractor have entered into that certain NRP Funding Agreement No. 43476 dated the 6th day of March, 2018, and amended the 10th day of October, 2018 (the "Contract") for a Neighborhood Revitalization Program Action Plan activity; and

WHEREAS, the Contractor would like an increase to the Contract amount and a change to the Scope of Services.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree to amend said Contract as follows:

1. The Contract amount shall be increased by \$17,000.00 for a new Contract total of \$62,000.00.
2. Exhibit A to the Contract is replaced in its entirety by Exhibit A-1.
3. All other terms and conditions of said Contract unaltered hereby shall remain in full force and effect and are hereby ratified and reaffirmed.

Scope of Service/Budget
Youth Programming Partnership Initiatives

The East Phillips Improvement Coalition (EPIC) will partner with organizations in and around the Phillips Community to enhance and expand academic, leadership and wellness programming for neighborhood youth in furtherance of the purposes of the Neighborhood Revitalization Program in the East Phillips neighborhood.

As EPIC identifies these partnerships, it will: (1) prepare a partnership summary identifying the NRP Statutory purpose to be achieved and describing how the partnership will meet the NRP Statutory purpose; (2) prepare a proposed budget, including the number of people involved, hours to be worked, materials and supplies, other items for which NRP funds will be requested, and the costs of the proposed partnership; and (3) identify the final work product, report or other deliverable to be completed through the partnership that will show that the NRP purpose has been achieved. This summary and budget will be submitted to the City Development Finance Division (DFD). DFD will work with Hennepin County Human Services Department on certification of activity. Final partnership details will be subject to approval by the EPIC Board. Upon DFD and Board approval, the program summary and budget will become an addendum to this contract. No work shall commence, nor shall any expenditures be incurred until DFD and the Board have approved the applicable summary and budget.
